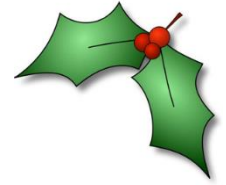




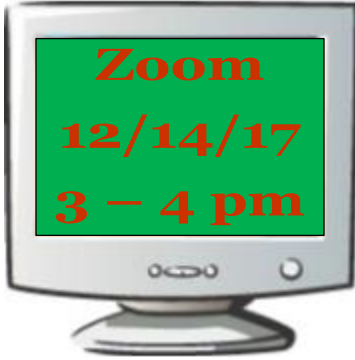

Favorite thing about PBIS: My favorite thing about PBIS is the overall structure... [that] calls for teaching students the behavioral expectations and rewarding them for demonstrating the expectations versus waiting for misbehavior to occur ... The creation of the behavior matrix and acknowledgment system allows schools to be proactive and demonstrate what positive interactions with others should look like.

PBIS Tip for Coaches: My tip for coaches is "teamwork". I am thankful for the district and individual school teams that work together to establish a climate in which positive and appropriate behavior is the "norm".
